Panel Discussion: Women in Manufacturing Leadership

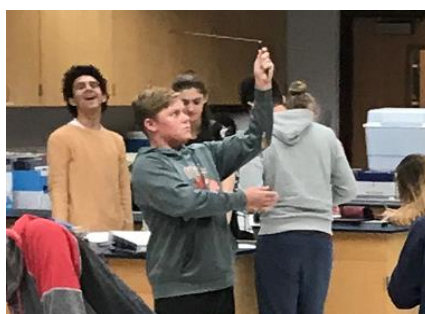

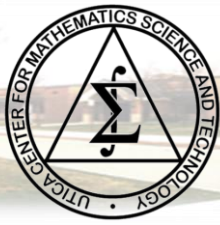

Requirements include a 3.0 GPA, a minimum score of 22 on your ACT and/or 1100 on your SAT, goal statement and documentation of at least 10 hours of community service. The deadline to apply for the B.S.N. Direct Admit for Freshmen pathway is November 15.

HOW TO BE SUCCESSFUL AT JOB FAIRS

- 1) **Walk up to the booth, make eye contact with the recruiter, smile and say hello.**
- 2) **Offer your handshake and introduce yourself.**
- 3) **Ask about career opportunities for your occupation at that company.**
- 4) **Deliver a 15 second sales pitch.**
- 5) **Answer the recruiter's questions and follow up with questions of your own.**
- 6) **Tell the recruiter you would like to apply for that job or position.**
- 7) **Off the recruiter a copy of your resume.**
- 8) **Ask how you can schedule a job interview.**
- 9) **Ask for a business card.**
- 10) **Thank the recruiter, smile, offer your handshake, and then move on to the next employer's booth.**
